The concept of the 'forest school' was developed in northern Europe during the 1950's and later became a key part of the education narrative at kindergartens and elementary schools throughout the continent. In the UK alone, there are now over 10,000 forest schools as the evidence for forest school children is clear – they perform better overall later in life. According to Plymouth Marjon University (2023) "Research in the UK into Forest School and its impacts on young children found positive impacts on children in terms of confidence, social skills, language and communication, motivation and concentration, physical skills and knowledge and understanding".



Child Pick up / Drop off

W.I.S.E. can pick up your child from W.I.S.E.'s city centre classroom enroute to W.I.S.E. Forest School and drop off at the same location afterwards. Alternative pick up locations may also be possible (but extra fees may incur depending on the location). School bus spaces are limited and will operate on a first-come first-serve basis.

This service will cost an additional 4,000 per month.

Please note that W.I.S.E. Forest School has car parking, but it is very limited. Therefore, when using this facility, we ask that you arrive and leave promptly. Thank you for understanding.

W.I.S.E. Forest School is proud to state that we have prepared a great indoor English classroom for our students. The reason we are proud of this is because the very concept of a 'forest school' is to provide all of the education and activities outside! In addition, we have an incredible forest library for children to read, relax and enjoy nature, whilst gazing at the forest outside.

The majority of conventional forest schools also have no toilet facilities! At W.I.S.E. however we have installed a toilet in the designated toilet building for use any time.

Environmentally, our aim is to be as plastic-free as possible, using local products, organic food and environmentally-friendly materials. Great!





- At W.I.S.E. International Forest School there will be fire-making, use of tools and equipment, natural resource collection, forest walking, insect collection and others.
